

The Political Reform Act of 1974 requires every local government agency to have a “Conflict of Interest Code”¹ and review it each even-numbered year. The Conflict-of-Interest Code designates positions required to file Statements of Economic Interests (Form 700) and assigns disclosure categories specifying the types of interests to be reported.

Plumas County Board of Supervisors is designated their code reviewing body of all local agencies’ conflict of interest code.

Pursuant to Government Code Section 87306.5, notification is sent to special districts and other agencies within Plumas County that Conflict of Interest Codes need to be reviewed to determine if it is accurate or if changes are needed. The County Counsel’s Office is tasked to perform this notification on a biennial basis. On May 10, 2024, I mailed out the 2024 Local Agency Biennial Notice to all required agencies with a deadline to return this information before October 1, 2024.
