**Resolution of Requesting Additional Time In Order to Address the Sustainable Sierra Nevada Initiative as Proposed by the Sierra Nevada Conservancy**

**WHEREAS**, the Sierra Nevada Conservancy (SNC) is proposing the adoption of a Sustainable Sierra Nevada Initiative to address issues related to forest management, the threat of catastrophic fires and the need for sustainable local economies; and

**WHEREAS**, the SNC is proposing in this initiative to work in cooperation with local communities and others to identify, initiate and support actions to achieve the long-term environmental, economic and social well-being of the Sierra Nevada Region; and

**WHEREAS**, the Sustainable Sierra Nevada Initiative could have significant and far-reaching impacts on Plumas County; and

**WHEREAS**, the Plumas County Board of Supervisors has just recently been apprised of the proposal for the adoption of the Sustainable Sierra Nevada Initiative and believes the County's participation and the input that may be provided by the County necessitate that the Board be provided additional time in order to address the proposed Sustainable Sierra Nevada Initiative.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE PLUMAS COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS**, that the Board requests that consideration of the initiative by the SNC Board be postponed until its June, 2010, meeting so that the county can receive more details about the proposal, participate in discussions regarding specific provisions of the initiative and respond accordingly.




