Commenced survey at stone with chiseled cross, which I accepted as the $\frac{1}{4}$ corner to sections 1 and 2, T24N R9E. From said $\frac{1}{4}$ corner I ran northerly on a random line and found a 2" capped iron pipe and rock mound which I accepted as the N.W. corner of said section 1, T24N R9E. I then ran easterly on a random line and found a hand hewn post in a rock mound that I accepted as the N. $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of said section 1, T24N R9E. I thence continued easterly on a random line and found a rock mound with a hand hewn post that I accepted as the N.E. corner to said section 1, T24N R9E.

I then commenced again at $\frac{1}{4}$ corner to sections 1 and 2, T24N R9E. I thence ran southerly on a random line for approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ mile and after making a careful search I was unable to find the S.W. corner of said section 1, T24N R9E. I thence ran easterly on a random line for approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ mile and after careful search I was unable to find the south $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of said section 1, T24N R9E. I thence continued easterly for approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ mile and found a fence corner. I tied in said fence corner and after talking to Mr. Watson, the county surveyor, I accepted this fence corner as being the S.E. corner of said section, 1 T24N R9E. I thence ran northerly on a random line and found a $\frac{1}{2}$ " plugged iron pipe from which a 36" blazed pine tree bears N31°10'E 29.7 feet. I accepted said $\frac{1}{2}$ " plugged iron pipe as the east $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of said section 1, T24N R9E. I thence continued northerly on a random line and closed my traverse at the N.E. corner of said section 1, T24N R9E.

I then commenced at a traverse point near the S.W. corner of section 1, T24N R9E and ran westerly on a random line for approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ mile and after a careful search was unable to find the south $\frac{1}{4}$ corner of section 2, T24N R9E. I then continued west on a random line and found a 1" iron pipe set in a rock mound from which a 30" blazed pine tree bears S41°50'W 60.9 feet and a 24" blazed pine tree bears S19°40'E 45.6 feet. I accepted the 1" iron pipe in the rock mound as being the S.W. corner of section 2, T24N R9E.

In accepting the corners referred to above, I was guided by a conversation with Mr. AJ Watson, County Surveyor, Plumas County, California

NOTE: The basis of bearings of this survey is the East line of the N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 1, T24N R9E M.D.B. & M. which equals North.
