NOTES

A. HISTORY OF PUBLIC LAND SURVEYS

The line between Township 22 North, Range 9 East, and Township 22 North, Range 10 East, was first surveyed by Arthur Keddie in 1870. This line was retraced by D.C. Hall in 1881 when he subdivided Township 22 North, Range 10 East. Most of Township 22 North, Range 9 East was subdivided in 1884 by D.C. Hall.

B. RETRACE OF THE RANGE LINE

From the proportioned Northwest Corner of Section 19, a Stone Mound used as a local corner bears $58^{\circ}09'07''W \sim 189.18$ feet. A 50' White Fir Bearing Tree, correctly scribed, bears $515^{\circ}W \sim 44.9$ feet from this corner. There is no record of this Bearing Tree in either Keddie's or Hall's field notes and both men state that no convenient trees existed. The blaze, by ring count, dates to 1884. Keddie's survey was made in 1870 and Hall's survey in 1881. Because this corner does not agree with record distance to other corners on the west line of Range 10 East and does not fit the topographic calls it was not accepted.

The Northwest Corner and the West Quarter Corner of Section 19 were established by single proportion between the Southwest Corner of Section 19 and the Northwest Corner of Section 18. The Northwest Corner of Section 18 is an original Keddie corner with bearing trees still in existence. The Southwest Corner of Section 19 is marked by a large Mound of Rock with no original accessories remaining. The Southwest Corner of Section 30 is marked by a large Stone Mound located on a brushy ridge. No original Bearing Trees were marked. This corner is consistent with all topographic calls and was accepted as original. The West Quarter Corner of Section 30, a Rock Mound, was recovered by retracing the tie given from the Northeast Corner of M.S. No. 2541, the Chalcedonia Consolidated Placer Mine, surveyed in December 1886 by Charles Hendel.

The calls given in Keddie's field notes of the Range Line were retraced from the Southwest Corner of Section 30 North to the Northwest Corner of Section 18. Without exception, they were in agreement with his notes. An extensive search was made for both the West Quarter Corner of Section 18 and the West Quarter Corner of Section 19 and no evidence was found.

Keddie's distances were used for setting proportionate corners because Hall's east and west calls on ties to the Range Line are completely erroneous.
