A ponderosa pine 8 ins. diam., bears S 30° E, 21 lks. (13.9 ft.) dist., mkd. E 1/16 S20 BT

A ponderosa pine, 12 ins. diam., bears S 86 1/2° W 29.5 lks. (19.5 ft.) dist., mkd. X BT


Found: standard 3 1/4 in. BLM brass cap 2 ins. above ground in rock mound. Original BLM 1984 BTs:

A ponderosa pine, 10 ins. diam., alive & healthy, with healed blaze, bears S 30° E 21 lks.

A ponderosa pine, 15 ins. diam., alive & healthy, with healed blaze & large X bark scribe, bears S 86 1/2° W 29.5 lks.

Set: a slate stone 20 x 12 x 6 ins. from which bears a:

Sugar pine, 14 ins. dia. N 39° E 282 lks. (186.1 ft.)

Sugar pine, 24 ins. dia. S 67 1/2° E, 167 lks. (110.2 ft.)

Fir, 18 ins. dia. S 39 1/2° W 157 lks. (103.6 ft.)

Pitch pine, 28 ins. dia. N 30 1/2° W 200 lks. (132.0 ft.)

Found: an unmarked granite stone, 20 x 11 x 5 ins. (Record: 20 x 12 x 6 ins.), set in a mound of stone, 3 ft. diam., 12 ins. high, from which the remains of the original bearing trees

A pine, 43 ins. diam., bears S 67 1/2° E, 156 lks. (103.0 ft.) dist., with overgrown blaze

A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S 44° W, 166 lks. (109.6 ft.) dist., with overgrown blaze (Record: S 39 1/2° W 157 lks. (103.6 ft.) dist.)

A pine, 44 ins. diam., bears N 34° W, 212 lks. (139.9 ft.) dist., with illegible scribe marks visible on old open blaze (Record: N 30 1/2° W, 200 lks., (132.0 ft.) dist.)

Set: an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground, with brass cap.

Deposit stone alongside iron post and rebuild the mound of stone 2 1/2 ft. base, around post to top.

Found: an iron post, 2 1/2 ins. diam., firmly set, projecting 8 ins. above the ground, and in a mound of stone, 3 ft. base, with brass cap mkd. As described in the field notes of the 1989 remonumentation record, from which the remains of the original bearing trees

A pine, 45 ins. diam., bears S 65 3/4° E, 159 lks. (104.9 ft.) dist., with healed blaze. (1880 Record, S 67 1/2° E 167 lks. (110.2 ft.))

A white fir, 38 ins. diam., bears S 44 1/2° W, 163 lks. (107.6 ft.) dist., with healed blaze. (1880 Record, S 39 1/2° W., 157 lks. (103.6 ft.))

A ponderosa pine, 45 ins. diam., bears N 33 1/4° W, 215.5 lks. (142.2 ft.) dist., with illegible scribing visible on old, partially opened blaze. (1880 Record, N 30 1/2° W, 200 lks. (132.0 ft.))

Found: standard 3 1/4 in. BLM brass cap flush with top of rock mound.

No evidence of original NE BT.

A pine, 48 ins. diam., alive & healthy with healed blaze, bears S 65 3/4° E 159 lks. (Original)

A fir, 40 ins. diam., alive & healthy with healed blaze, bears S 44 1/2° W 163 lks. (Original)

A ponderosa pine snag, 45 ins. diam., with scribing visible on partially open face, bears N 33 1/4° W 215.5 lks. (Original)



A cedar, 16 ins. dia. bears N 18° E 29 lks. (19.1 ft.)

Wm. Minto, GLO, 1880

Found: no corner

Set: a granite stone 16 x 10 x 5 ins., from which bears a

Sugar pine, 30 in. dia. N 78 1/2° E 70 lks. (46.2 ft.)

Pitch pine 36, in. dia. N 87° W 45 lks. (29.7 ft.)

Found: a granite stone, 18 x 15 x 7 ins. mkd. 1/4 on the S face, set in an old

embedded mound of stone, 3 ft. diam., 10 ins. high, from which the original bearing trees

A sugar pine, 42 ins. diam., bears N 81° E 72 lks. (47.5 ft.) dist., with overgrown blaze. (Record: N 78 1/2° E, 70 lks. (46.2 ft.) dist.)

A yellow pine, 38 ins. diam., bears S 89 1/2° W 46 lks. (30.4 ft.) dist., with scribe marks 1/4 S BT visible on old open blaze. (Record: N 87 1/2° W., 45 lks. (29.7 ft.) dist.)

Set: an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 20 ins. in the ground with brass cap

Rebuild the mound of stone, 3 ft. base, around post to top, deposit marked stone in the mound.

Found: standard 3 1/4 in. BLM brass cap flush with top of ring of rocks & earth 3 ft. diam. & 4 ins. high, from which

A pine snag, 42 ins. diam., no marks visible, bears N 81° E 48.5 ft. (Record: 47.5 ft.) (original)



Set:

Found: an oak post 48 x 4 x 4 from which bears a:

Pitch pine, 36 ins. dia., N 78 1/2° E 59 lks. (38.9 ft.)

Yellow pine, 8 in. dia., S 45° E 58 lks. (38.3 ft.)

Yellow pine, 36 in. dia., S 45 1/2° W 62 lks. (40.9 ft.)

A pine snag, bears S 43° W 62 lks. (40.9 ft.) dist., with scribe marks TXXIVN SXII visible on old open blaze. (Record: S 45 1/2° W)

A stump hole, bears N 47 1/2° W 98 lks. (64.7 ft.) dist. (Record: N 49° W 95 lks. (62.7 ft.) dist.)

Set: an iron post, 28 ins. long, 2 1/2 ins. diam., 18 ins. in the ground with brass cap from which

A pine, 12 ins. diam., bears S 35° W 23 1/2 lks. (15.5 ft.) dist., mkd. T24N R10E S12 BT

A cedar, 7 ins. diam., bears N 35° W 13 lks. (8.6 ft.) dist., mkd. T24N R10E S1 BT

Rebuild the mound of stone, 3 ft. base around post to top.

Found: standard 3 1/4 in. BLM brass cap with cap flush with top of a 3 ft. x 1 ft. high rock mound.

Original GLO BTs:

A sugar pine, mostly rotted, N 78° E 38.9 ft.

No evidence of original SE BT

A pine snag, 36 ins. diam., bears S 43° W 40.9 ft. The main trunk is just downhill from the stump. Found entire face visible scribing.

No evidence of the original NW BT.

A pine, 15 ins. diam., with healed blaze, bears S 35° W 15.5 ft.


A cedar, 10 ins. diam., with healed blaze, bears N 33° W 8.1 ft. (Record: N 35° W 8.6 ft.)
