All bearing trees are painted with red bands and have Bearing Tree (54-3) and Land Survey Monument (54-9) signs attached. 3. All new bearing trees have an aluminum nail side center for distance measurement. 4. Bearings and distances to new bearing trees were measured using a Warren Knight staff compass with tripod, a logger's tape, a diameter tape and clinometer, or a Nikon Total Station from established control. Bearings to bearing trees at corners not needing new accessories were checked against the record with a hand compass. The project magnetic declination was determined to be 15° East using the National Geophysical Data Center web site. 5. Corners controlling the National Forest Boundary, as shown herein, are posted with Property Boundary (54-2) signs, with a Land Survey Monument (54-9) sign on nearby post. 6. Other controlling corners, as shown herein, are posted with a nearby Land Survey Monument (54-9) sign. 7. National Forest Property Boundary signs were set at an interval not exceeding 250 ft. Posts for sign attachment are 6 ft. long galvanized "U" channel posts.
